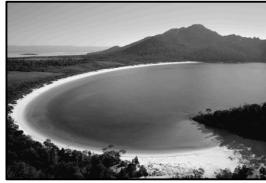


# the freycinet escape

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## The Freycinet Peninsula?

An absorbing mix of blue seas, red granite mountains & stunning white beaches, the Freycinet coastline will take your breath away. As will the encounters with seals, dolphins, birds, and wallabies. Declared a National Park in 1916, Freycinet contains a rich tapestry of animal and plant life. A place where a lasting aboriginal history, European exploration & settlement, along with major geological upheaval have left their enduring mark.

## Freycinet Lodge?

Tasmania's premier resort set within the Freycinet National Park. The Lodge designed for minimal impact and maximum welcome, with views that hypnotise. Could there be a place more suited to unwind and become immersed in nature's sensual, calming pleasures?

## The camp?

Just because you are camping does not mean you have to rough it. You will have all the luxuries without losing the experience of camping in the Tasmanian wilderness. Enjoy comfortable bedding, the best china, wine glasses and even a private toilet.

## The climate?

Tasmania's Freycinet Coast enjoys a temperate climate, with an average summer temperature of 24 degrees. Making it the ideal venue for outdoor adventures.

## Will I be walking everyday?

No. The Beyond Wineglass package has been designed to allow you the best of both worlds. A combination of a boat cruise and overnight camp, followed by a relaxing two night stay in the Freycinet Lodge, where your itinerary is again your own. Your walking will commence on Day 2 and allows for a 5 hour day walk back to Freycinet Lodge.

## How fit do I need to be? Is the walking difficult?

Travelling by boat allows us to explore Freycinet's coastline and inaccessible offshore islands and reduces the amount of walking we have to do and the amount of equipment you need to carry. The majority of your walk is along flat bush tracks and beaches, with a section of steep climb towards the end. The walk will take approximately 5 hours. Fitness levels are best described as the basically fit and actively mobile.

## What are the facilities like?

In order to ensure minimal impact on the environment we provide a simple flush toilet and with water a scarce resource we offer short solar shower facilities and wash basins.

## What if the weather is bad?

When dealing with the outdoors weather is one thing we cannot guarantee. The tour is designed to ensure you remain comfortable even if the weather takes a turn for the worse. There may even be days when we are unable to travel by boat. Under such circumstances alternative arrangements will be made, including walking.

## Do I have to carry a big pack?

You travel light, carrying only your personal gear (approx. 6-7 kilo's) in a small daypack. All other equipment will be provided for you.

## What do I need to bring?

With the right preparation this can be kept fairly minimal. We will provide you with a full checklist of recommended gear upon booking. We will provide all camping and sleeping equipment including: tents, bedding, small torch, daypack and a bath towel.

## Do I need insurance?

Although travel insurance is not compulsory we highly recommend you take out insurance. Ensure you purchase a policy that will cover you for all the activities you might be undertaking whilst on holiday. Should trips be cancelled due to reasons beyond our control, then this insurance policy is necessary in order for you to obtain refunds.

## What can I do while I'm at the Lodge?

Just because you have done the walk to Wineglass Bay do not think it is all over. There are a multitude of experiences to be had in Freycinet, from short walks and drives to a vast variety of adventure activities. All within easy reach of the Lodge. A full list of activities will be forwarded to you upon confirmation and our staff will be happy to assist you with any bookings.

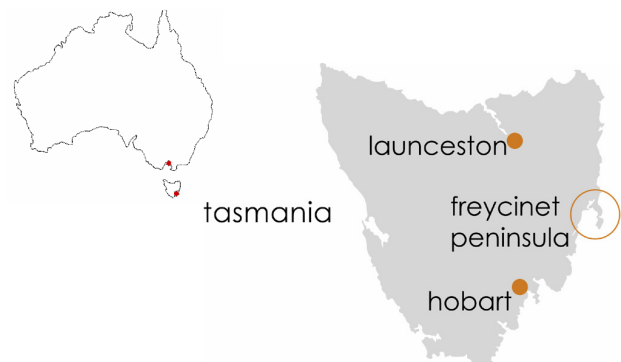
## Private Groups?

Generally we can run tours for any private group of 6-10 people at a price similar to that listed. Please speak to our staff if you wish to investigate options for a private group or family.

## How can I get to the Lodge?

We recommend you hire a car. The road along the East Coast is a wonderful driving experience and a car will allow you to visit the areas surrounding Freycinet, including the many wineries, local towns and other scenic destinations. Alternatively we can arrange for pick-up and drop off in either Hobart or Launceston.

Coles Bay and the Freycinet National Park are on Tasmania's East Coast. Approximately 2 ½ hours drive from Hobart and Launceston.
